Complete this form to request enforcement of terms of court-ordered legal decision-making or parenting time if:

- You have an Arizona order establishing the terms of parenting time/and or legal decision-making, and
- A party violates a provision of the decree, temporary order, or injunction for legal decision-making or parenting time.

NOTE: These forms cannot be used if your legal decision-making or parenting time was not entered by an Arizona court. Out-of-state court orders may be enforced in Arizona if you follow certain specified procedures. You may wish to contact an attorney regarding such enforcement.

To complete this form and file the request you will need:

- Information from the order(s) you wish to have enforced.
- A copy of the order establishing legal decision-making or parenting time if that order was issued by the Superior Court of Arizona in a county other than one you will file the request. Attach that order to the Request to Enforce when you file it.

NOTE: The order you attach must be the most recent order for legal decision-making or parenting time

Follow these instructions numbered to match the identifying numbers on the form. Type or print neatly using black ink.

- 1. Fill in your name, address, and telephone number as the person who is requesting enforcement of the order that established terms of court-ordered legal decision-making or parenting time. (An attorney must also list the name of the person represented and the attorney's State Bar Number.)
- 2. Fill in the name of the person who is shown as the petitioner on the court order that established the terms of legal decision-making and/or parenting time.
- 3. Fill in the name of the person who is shown as the respondent on the document you are using for Item 3.
- 4. If the order you are asking to have enforced was issued in the same county in which you are filing this request, fill in the case number of that order. Otherwise, leave this space blank.

- 5. Mark the "Legal Decision-Making" box if you are seeking to enforce the terms of a legal decision-making order or mark the "Parenting Time" box if you are seeking to enforce the terms of a parenting time order.
- 6. Fill in the date of the order you are requesting to have enforced
- 7. Fill in the name of the judicial officer who signed the order.
- 8. State the terms of legal decision-making and/or parenting time set forth in the order.
- 9. Fill in the name of the person whom you believe violated the order.
- 10. Write a brief summary describing how the terms of the court order establishing legal decision-making and/or parenting time were violated. You may continue writing on the back of a page or attach an extra page if you run out of space.
- 11. Check only one of these two boxes: Check the box for "seven (7) days" only if you want the hearing set very quickly AND you believe you can have the Order to Appear served on the other party at least three (3) days (not including weekends or holidays) before the hearing date. Otherwise, check the box for "thirty (30) days."
- 12. Sign on the line. Consistent with Rule 14(b), ARFLP, you are signing under penalty of perjury and declaring that the information is true and correct.

When you have completed this form:

- Complete an Order to Appear (Enforcement of Legal Decision-Making/Parenting Time)
- File the original of each document with the Clerk of the Superior Court. (There will be a fee for filing this form. There may be additional fees including an appearance fee if this is your first appearance in this case. If you cannot pay these fees, they can be waived or deferred. The Clerk of the Superior Court has the necessary forms to ask for waiver or deferral.)
- Serve a copy of the Request to Enforce Legal Decision-Making/Parenting Time and Order to Appear (Enforcement of Legal Decision-Making/Parenting Time) on the other party.
