What is a "Consent and Waiver?"

If the minor's legal parents agree with you being appointed as the minor's guardian, they can sign this consent and waive notice of the hearing on the appointment. If the minor's parents **do not** sign this consent, you must provide them with Notice of Hearing and file a Proof of Notice with the court. See Packet # 4, *Notice of Hearing & Proof of Notice.*

If the minor is 14 years old, or older, they must also be provided notice or sign this consent and waiver form. By signing this document, the parent and the minor are stating to the court that they consent to you being appointed as the minor's guardian.

Should I see a lawyer for help?



Court cases can be very complicated, and even if you are representing yourself you should see a lawyer for legal advice about how the law applies to you and what is best in your particular situation. This might save you time, money, and trips to court

and help you to avoid serious mistakes. There are lawyers who will help you on a limited basis. They will only charge for giving the help you need, and you can complete the court papers on your own or ask the lawyer for help.
