



Juvenile Bench Essential Hearings

Juvenile Bench Presiding Judge: Hon. Peter Hochuli, Division 13

The following hearings will be conducted in-person if the child has been detained, unless otherwise ordered by the Court:

- Detention hearings
- Trial reviews
- Adjudications
- Dispositions
- Evidentiary hearings

The following hearings may be conducted in person if requested by a party, or as ordered by the Court:

- Contested dependencies
- Contested severances
- Temporary custody hearings
- Rule 59 Motions
- Other hearings required by law to be heard at juvenile subject to a statutory or juvenile rules timelines, or as the Court may deem appropriate or necessary

All other matters will be conducted telephonically, unless, for good cause shown, the Court orders otherwise.

In addition to necessary courtroom staff and support personnel, those attending hearings in person may include parties and their attorneys, parents in delinquency matters, victims and victim witness advocates and witnesses. All others, including placement representatives, supporting family, and service providers, must appear by phone.

Witnesses may appear by telephone through agreement of the parties or as ordered by the Court pursuant to Ariz. R. P. Juv. Ct. 42.
