What Mediation is for?

Mediation is for parents who need help in writing a parenting plan for their minor children.

If you and the other parent cannot agree on how legal decisions will be made for your children or when the children will spend time with each of you, you will be required to attend mediation.

Mediation is when you meet with a neutral third party, and it is a free service through the Conciliation Court.

You can use this packet to ask for this service. This can be done at any time after the other parent has filed a “response”.



What Mediation is not for?

Mediation is not for deciding child support or other money issues.

It also will not help you enforce a parenting plan that is already in place.

You can't use mediation for paternity cases if paternity has not yet been established through the court.

If you need help to enforce a parenting plan, child support, or establish paternity, go to www.sc.pima.gov to find the proper forms.

Which form do I fill out?

There are 3 different forms that you can use to ask for mediation.

The form that you choose will depend on your situation.

Are you and the other parent willing to attend mediation?

If you and the other parent are both willing to attend mediation then use the form **STIPULATION TO MEDIATE LEGAL DECISION-MAKING AND/OR PARENTING TIME**. Both sides, either you and the other parent, or your attorneys must sign this form for mediation to happen.

If the other parent is not willing to attend mediation or you are not sure if the other parent is willing to attend mediation then answer the next question...

Do you have an active court case?

YES If you have an active court case, then use the form **CURRENT LEGAL DECISION-MAKING AND/OR PARENTING TIME ACTION BEFORE THE COURT**.

Your active court case could be a divorce petition, a petition to change legal decision-making and/or parenting time after a divorce is final, or a paternity case where paternity has already been established through the court and one parent asked the court to start or change legal decision making and/or parenting time.

NO If you *do not* have an active court case, then use the form **NO CURRENT LEGAL DECISION-MAKING AND/OR PARENTING TIME ACTION BEFORE THE COURT (POST DECREE/POST JUDGEMENT)**.

You can also use this form if you have a paternity case where paternity has been established through the court but no parenting plan is in place.

This goes with 3 additional forms: **Response to Request for Post-Decree or Post Judgment Mediation, Request for Order Granting or Denying Request for Mediation, and Order Regarding Request for Post-Decree/Post-Judgment Mediation**.



Instructions for Completing Stipulation to Mediate Legal Decision- Making and/or Parenting Time

5. Describe the issues to be discussed

- Describe what you would like to resolve during mediation.

6. Purpose for mediation

- Write in the names and ages of the children who are the subject of the mediation.

- Put a checkmark in the box to tell the court who signed the form.

- Put a checkmark in the box to tell the court who signed the form.

9. Name and Address of the Parties (Please Print)

- Write down the contact information for both you and the other parent.

You have finished filling out the form.

Note: Both parties should complete the mandatory Domestic Relations Education on Children's Issues course (parent education) prior to mediation in pre-decree and in paternity cases in which there are no permanent orders for legal decision-making and/or parenting time. After you pay the course fee at the Clerk of the Superior Court, register for the parent education class at: <http://www.sc.pima.gov/fccc/parented> or by calling (520) 724-4949.

In post-decree cases and in paternity cases where parties are requesting a change of legal decision-making and/or parenting time, parent education will be required prior to mediation only upon the order of the assigned Judge.

 You have 20 days from the date you are served with this request to file a response. Your response must be filed with the Clerk of the Court, Arizona Superior Court, Pima County, 110 W. Congress, Tucson, AZ 85701. A copy of your response must be sent to the assigned Judge and to the party filing the request.

The Petitioner or Respondent states:

- There is a dispute between the parties regarding legal decision-making or parenting time and the parties have agreed in writing in the most recent parenting plan or were ordered to seek mediation as a method of resolving prior disputes prior to petitioning the Court for a hearing, and the parties are not willing to voluntarily agree to attend mediation at the Conciliation Court,
- AND/OR
- There is an order adjudicating paternity, but no legal decision-making or parenting time orders entered in a paternity action,
- AND/OR
- It has been more than 1 year since the most recent court-ordered legal decision-making/parenting plan, and there is a significant change in a parent's or child(ren)'s circumstances which would warrant a change in the existing orders, and all parties are not willing to voluntarily agree to attend mediation.

1 Make 3 copies of the form.

2 Take the original form and file it with the Clerk of the Superior Court:

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“SERVE” the form to the other parent.

You must now arrange to have these papers served on the other parent:

1. **No Current Legal Decision-Making and/or Parenting Time Action Before the Court (Post-Decree/Post-Judgment form.**
2. **Response to Request for Mediation**

The first form is the one you just completed. The second form **Response to Request for Mediation** should be blank. The other parent will need to complete and file that form.

The waiting period...

You have to wait 20 days to see if the other parent files a response.

If the other parent responds before the 20 days then you can continue with the Request for Order Granting or Denying Mediation form.

NOTICE TO PARTIES: THIS IS A COURT ORDER. IF MEDIATION IS ORDERED AND YOU FAIL TO ATTEND YOU MAY BE SUBJECT TO SANCTIONS BY THE COURT.

The Court has reviewed the Request for Post-Decree/Post-Judgment Mediation and considered any response and finds that adequate cause has been shown has not been shown.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

- The Request for Mediation is APPROVED. This matter is referred to the Family Center of the Conciliation Court for setting a mediation date and time. The parties shall attend mediation as set forth in a separate order issued through Conciliation Court. It is further ordered:
- The parties are not required to attend the Domestic Relations Education on Children's Issues Course.
- OR
- If the parties have not previously attended the mandatory Domestic Relations Education on Children's Issues Course (Parent Education), they are required to attend within 30 days of this order, and prior to the first mediation date. Once parties pay the class fee at the Clerk of Court, parties may register at <http://www.sc.pima.gov/fccc/parented> or by calling (520) 724-4949.

The Steps for filing the Request for Order Granting or Denying Request for Mediation Form

1 Make 3 copies of the form and keep one copy for yourself.

2 Take the original form and file it with the Clerk of the Superior Court:

3 Mail out the other two copies:

- One to the other parent or his/her attorney.
- The other goes to your assigned Judge along with the form called Order Regarding Request for Post- Decree/Post-Judgment Mediation.

On the top part of the Order form, fill in the caption information on the upper left hand side the petitioner's name, the respondent's name, the superior court case number, and the name of your assigned Judge. If you do not know your assigned Judge, you may call Case Management Services at 724-4200.

You're done!

Now you must wait and see if the Judge decides that mediation needs to happen.

If the Judge agrees in favor of mediation, the Conciliation Court will schedule the mediation and mail out the orders to appear.
